OBJECTIVE OF THE ACTIVITY: To create awareness among students about the role of Hindi as the official language of India and to inspire them to develop a genuine interest in learning and using the language.

PROCEDURE/ REPORT: Hindi Diwas was celebrated to highlight the importance of Hindi as the official language of India and to encourage students to develop a genuine interest in learning it. The celebration aimed to help students understand that Hindi, which belongs to the Indo-Aryan branch of the Indo-European language family, holds a significant place in the nation's identity. Hindi Diwas is observed every year on 14th September to commemorate the day in 1949 when the Constituent Assembly of India adopted Hindi in the Devanagari script as the official language of the Republic of India. This decision was later enshrined in the Constitution of India, which came into effect on 26th January 1950, under Article 343. Today, Hindi is spoken not only across India but also in countries like Mauritius, Pakistan, Suriname, and Trinidad, with around 320 million native speakers, making it the fourth most spoken language in the world.

The event was conducted under the **chairmanship of Sri Ch. Hari Babu, Vice-Principal**, who opened the session with his encouraging remarks. Following this, **Dr. K. V. S. Koteswara Rao**, IQAC Coordinator, enlightened the audience about famous poets in Hindi and their contributions to Hindi literature."

Dr. G. Swarna Latha, Lecturer in the Department of Telugu, spoke about the evolution of Hindi and its status as an official language. **Sri Kishore Behara**, Academic Coordinator, highlighted the **sweetness and cultural richness** of the Hindi language. **Smt. N. Vasanthi**, Lecturer in the Department of English, discussed the role of **Bhakti literature in Hindi**, focusing particularly on the devotional poetry of **Saint Kabirdas**.



Finally, the event concluded with a **keynote address by the chief guest**, who narrated an inspiring **story emphasizing the beauty, history, and unifying role of the Hindi language**. The speaker encouraged students to take pride in Hindi and to embrace it not only as a subject but as a symbol of national identity and cultural heritage.







An **essay writing competition** was also organized as part of the celebration, where students expressed their views on the importance of Hindi. The **winners were announced and felicitated on stage** with certificates and prizes, which added excitement and motivation for all participants. The programme was attended by faculty members and students, who actively participated and showed great enthusiasm.
